Section I. Instructions to Bidders (ITB)

ITB shall be read in conjunction with the Section II, Bidding Data Sheet (BDS), which shall take precedence over ITB.

General

Bright Histoleymaic Bidders (118)

1. Scope of Bid 1.1 The purchaser indicated in the Bidding Data Sheet(BDS), issues these Bidding Documents for the supply of Goods and Related Services incidental thereto as specified in Section V, Schedule of Requirements. The name andidentification number of this procurement are specified in the BDS. Thename, identification, and number of lots (individual contracts), if any, are provided in the BDS.

1.2 Throughout these Bidding Documents:

- (a) The by mail (other than electronic mail) or hand delivered with proof of receipt;
- (b) If the context so requires, "singular" means "plural" and vice versa; and
- (c) "Day" means calendar day.
- 2. Source of Funds 2.1 Payments under this contract will be financed by the source specified in the BDS.
- 3. Ethics, Fraud and Corruption of
- 3.1 The attention of the bidders is drawn to the following guidelines of the Procurement Guidelines published by National Procurement Agency:

Parties associated with Procurement Actions, namely, suppliers/contractors and officials shall ensure that they maintain strict confidentiality throughout the process;

Officials shall refrain from receiving any personal gain from any Procurement Action. No gifts or inducement shall be accepted. Suppliers/contractors are liable to be disqualified from the bidding process if found offering any gift or inducement which may have an effect of influencing a decision or impairing the objectivity of an official.

- 3.2 The Purchaser requires the bidders, suppliers, contractors, and consultants to observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts. In pursuit of this policy:
 - (a) "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution;

- (b) "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation or omission of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract;
- (c) "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more bidders, with or without the knowledge of the Purchaser to establish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels; and
- (d) "Coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the procurement process or affect the execution of a contract.
- 3.3 If the Purchaser found any unethical practices as stipulated under ITB Clause 3.2, the Purchaser will reject a bid, if it is found that a Bidder directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract in question.
- 4. Eligible Bidders 4.1 All bidders shall possess legal rights to supply the Goods under this contract.
 - 4.2 A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All bidders found to have conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Bidders may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this bidding process, if they:
 - (a) are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Purchaser to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under these Bidding Documents; or
 - (b) submit more than one bid in this bidding process. However, this does not limit the participation of subcontractors in more than one bid.
 - 4.3 A Bidder that is under a declaration of ineligibility by the National Procurement Agency (NPA), at the date of submission of bids or at the date of contract award, shall be disqualified. The list of debarred firms is available at the website of, Ministry of Finance.
 - 4.4 Foreign Bidder may submit a bid only if so stated in the in the BDS.

- 5Eligible Goods and RelatedServices
- 5.1All goods supplied under this contract shall be complied with applicable standards stipulated by the Sri LankaStandards Institute (SLSI) In the absence of suchstandards; the Goods supplied shall be complied with other internationally accepted standards.

- 6.2 The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the Bidding Documents. Failure to furnish all information or documentation required by the Bidding Documents may result in the rejection of the bid.

7. Clarification of Bidding Documents

7.1

A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Documents including the restrictivenessofspecifications shall contact the Purchaser in writing at the Purchaser's address specified in the BDS. The Purchaser will respond in writing to any request for clarification, provided that such request is received no later than ten (10) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids. The Purchaser shall forward copies of its response to all those who have purchased the Bidding Documents, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source. Should the Purchaser deem it necessary to amend the Bidding Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under ITB Clause 8.

- 8. Amendment of Bidding Documents
- At any time prior to the deadline for submission of bids, the Purchaser may amend the Bidding Documents by issuing addendum.
- 8.2 Any addendum issued shall be part of the Bidding Documents and shall be communicated in writing to all who have purchased the Bidding Documents.
- To give prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take an addendum into account in preparing their bids, the Purchaser may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of bids, pursuant to ITB Sub-Clause 23.2.

Preparation of Bids

- 9. Cost of Bidding
- 9.1 The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its bid, and the purchaser shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.
- 10. Language of Bid
- The Bid, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Bid (including supporting documents and printed literature) exchanged by the Bidder and the Purchaser, shall be written in English language.
- 11. Documents
 Comprising the
- 11.1 The Bid shall comprise the following:
 - (a) Bid Submission Form and the applicable Price Schedules in accordance with ITB Clauses 12, 14, and 15;
 - (b) Bid Security or Bid-Securing Declaration, in accordance with ITB Clause 20;

- (c) documentary evidence in accordance with ITB Clauses 18 and 29, that the Goods and Related Services conform to the Bidding Documents;

 (d) documentary evidence in accordance with ITB Clause 18 establishing the Bidder's qualifications to perform the contract if its bid is accepted; and

 (e) any other document required in the BDS.
- 12. Bid Submission Form and Price Schedules

The Bidder shall submit the Bid Submission Form using the form furnished in Section IV, Bidding Forms. This form must be completed without any alterations to its format, and no substitutes shall be accepted. All blank spaces shall be filled in with the information requested.

13. Alternative Bids14. Bid Prices and Discounts 13.1 Alternative bids shall not be considered.

The Bidder shall indicate on the Price Schedule the unit pricesand total bid prices of the goods it proposes to supply under the Contract.

Any discount offered against any single item in the price schedule shall be included in the unit price of the item. However, a Bidder wishes to offer discount as a lot the bidder may do so by indicating such amounts appropriately.

If so indicated in ITB Sub-Clause 1.1, bids are being invited for individual contracts (lots) or for any combination of contracts (packages). Unless otherwise indicated in theBDS, prices quoted shall correspond to 100 % of the items specified for each lot and to 100% of the quantities specified for each item of a lot. Bidders wishing to offer any price reduction (discount) for the award of more thanone Contract shall specify the applicable price reduction separately.

- (i) Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall include allduties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable by the Supplier:
 - (a) on components and raw material used in the manufacture or assembly of goods quoted; or
 - (b) on the previously imported goods of foreign origin
- (ii) However, VAT shall not be included in the price but shall be indicated separately;

- (iii) the price for inland transportation, insurance and other related services to deliver the goods to their final destination;
- (iv) the price of other incidental services
- 14.5 The Prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the Contract and not subject to variation on any account. A bid submitted with an adjustable price quotation will be treated as non-responsive and rejected, pursuant to ITB Clause 31.
- 14.6 All lots, if any and items must be listed and priced separately in the Price Schedules. If a Price Schedule shows items listed but not priced, their prices shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other items.
- 15. Currencies of Bid
- Unless otherwise stated in Bidding Data Sheet, the Bidder shall quote in Sri Lankan Rupees and payment shall be payable only in Sri Lanka Rupees.

- To establish their eligibility in accordance with ITB Clause 4,Bidders shall complete the Bid Submission Form, included in Section IV, Bidding Forms.
- Establishing the Conformity of the Goods and Related Services
- To establish the conformity of the Goods and Related Services to the Bidding Documents, the Bidder shall furnishas part of its Bid the documentary evidence that the Goods conform to the technical specifications and standards specified in Section V, Schedule of Requirements.
- The documentary evidence may be in the form of literature, drawings or data, and shall consist of a detailed item by item description (given in Section V, Technical Specifications) of the essential technical and performance characteristics of the Goods and Related Services, demonstrating substantial
 - responsiveness of the Goods and Related Services to the technical specification, and if applicable, a statement of deviations and exceptions to the provisions of the Schedule of Requirements.

 The Ridder shall also furnish a list giving full particulars
 - The Bidder shall also furnish a list giving full particulars, including quantities, available sources and current prices of spare parts, special tools, etc., necessary for the proper and continuing functioning of the Goods during the period if specified in the BDS following commencement of the use of the goods by the Purchaser.

- 18. Documents
 Establishing the
 Qualifications
 of the Bidder
- 18.1The documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications to perform the contract if its bid is accepted shall establish to the Purchaser's satisfaction:
 - (a) A Bidder that does not manufacture or produce the Goods it offers to supply shall submit the Manufacturer's Authorization using the form included in Section IV, Bidding Forms to demonstrate that it has been duly authorized by the manufacturer or producer of the Goods to supply these Goods;

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- (b) that, if required in the BDS, in case of a Bidder not doing business within Sri Lanka, the Bidder is or will be (if awarded the contract) represented by an Agent in Sri Lanka equipped and able to carry out the Supplier's maintenance, repair and spare parts-stocking obligations prescribed in the Conditions of Contract and/or Technical Specifications; and
- (c) that the Bidder meets each of the qualification criterion specified in Section III, Evaluation and Qualification Criteria.
- 19. Period of

19.1

Validity of Bids

Bids shall remain valid until the date specified in the BDS.A bid valid for a shorter date shall be rejected by the Purchaser as non-responsive.

19.2

In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the bid validity date, the Purchaser may request bidders to extend the period of validity of their bids. The request andthe responses shall be made in writing. If a Bid Security isrequested in accordance with ITB Clause 20, it shall also be extended for a corresponding period. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its Bid Security. A Bidder granting the request shall not be required or permitted to modify its bid.

- 20. Bid Security
- 20.1 The Bidder shall furnish as part of its bid, a Bid Security or a Bid-Securing Declaration, as specified in the BDS.
- 20.2 The Bid Security shall be in the amount specified in the BDS and denominated in Sri Lanka Rupees, and shall:
 - (a) at the bidder's option, be in the form of either a bankdraft, a letter of credit, or a bank guarantee from a banking institution;
 - (b) be issued by an institution acceptable to Purchaser.
 - (c)

Theacceptable institutes are published in the website, Ministry of Finance. substantially in accordance with the form included in Section IV, Bidding Forms;

- (d) be payable promptly upon written demand by the Purchaser in case the conditions listed in ITB Clause 20.5 are invoked;
- (e) be submitted in its original form; copies will not be accepted;
- (f) remain valid for the period specified in the BDS.
- 20.3 Any bid not accompanied by a substantially responsive Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 20.1 and 20.2, may be rejected by the Purchaser as non-responsive.
- 20.4 The Bid Security of unsuccessful Bidders shall be returned as promptly as possible upon the successful Bidder's furnishing of the Performance Security pursuant to ITB Clause 43.
- 20.5 The Bid Security may be forfeited or the Bid Securing Declaration executed:
 - (a) if a Bidder withdraws its bid during the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Submission Form, except as provided in ITB Sub-Clause 19.2; or
 - (b) if a Bidder does not agreeing to correction of arithmetical errors in pursuant to ITB Sub-Clause 30.3
 - (c) if the successful Bidder fails to:
 - (i) sign the Contract in accordance with ITB Clause 42;
 - (ii) Furnish a Performance Security in accordance with ITB Clause 43.
- 21Format and 21.1 Signing of Bid

The Bidder shall prepare one original of the documents comprising the bid as described in ITB Clause 11 and clearly mark it as "ORIGINAL." In addition, the Bidder shall submit a copy of the bid and clearly mark it as "COPY." In the event of any discrepancy between the original and the copy, the original shall prevail.

- The original and the Copy of the bid shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by a person duly authorized to sign on behalf of the Bidder.
- Any interlineations, erasures, or overwriting shall be validonly if they are signed or initialed by the person signing the Bid.

Submission and Opening of Bids

- 22. Submission, Sealing and Marking of Bids
- 22.1 Bidders may always submit their bids by mail or by hand.
 - (a) Bidders submitting bids by mail or by hand, shall enclose the original and the copy of the Bid in separate sealed envelopes, duly marking the envelopes as "ORIGINAL" and "COPY." These envelopes containing the original and the copy shall then be enclosed in one single envelope.

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- 22.2 The inner and outer envelopes shall:
 - (a) Bear the name and address of the Bidder;
 - (b) be addressed to the Purchaser in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 23.1;
 - (c) bear the specific identification of this bidding process as indicated in the BDS; and
 - (d) bear a warning not to open before the time and date for bid opening, in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 26.1.
 If all envelopes are not sealed and marked as required, the Purchaser will assume no responsibility for the misplacement or premature opening of the bid.
- 23. Deadline for Submission of Bids
- 23.1 Bids must be received by the Purchaser at the address and no later than the date and time specified in the BDS.
- 23.2 The Purchaser may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of bids by amending the Bidding Documents in accordance with ITB Clause 8, in which case all rights and obligations of the Purchaser and Bidders previously subject to the deadline shall thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.
- 24. Late Bids 24.1 The Purchaser shall not consider any bid that arrives after thedeadlineforsubmission of bids, in accordance with ITB Clause 23. Any bid received by the Purchaser after the deadline for submission of bids shall be declared late, rejected, and returned unopened to the Bidder.
- 25. Withdrawal, and Modification of Bids
- 25.1 A Bidder may withdraw, or modify its Bid after it has been submitted by sending a written notice in accordance with ITB Clause 22, duly signed by an authorized representative, and shall include a copy of the authorization in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 21.2, (except that no copies of the with drawls notice are required). The corresponding substitution or modification of the bid must accompany the respective written notice. All notices must be:

- (a) submitted in accordance with ITB Clauses 21 and 22(except that withdrawal notices do not require copies), and in addition, the respective envelopes shall beclearly marked "WITHDRAWAL," or "MODIFICATION;" and
- (b) received by the Purchaser prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of bids, in accordance with ITB Clause 23.
- 25.2 Bids requested to be withdrawn in accordance with ITBSub-Clause 25.1 shall be returned to the Bidders only uponnotification of contract award to the successful bidder in accordance with sub clause 41.1.
- No bid may be withdrawn, substituted, or modified in theinterval between the deadline for submission of bids and the expiration of the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Submission Form or any extension thereof.
- 26. Bid Opening 26.1 The Purchaser shall conduct the bid opening in public at theaddress, date and time specified in the BDS.

First, envelopes marked "WITHDRAWAL" shall be opened and read out and the envelope with the corresponding bidmay be opened at the discretion of the Purchaser. No bidwithdrawal shall be permitted unless the correspondingwithdrawal notice contains a valid authorization to requestthe withdrawal and is read out at bid opening. Envelopesmarked "MODIFICATION" shall be opened and read outwith the corresponding Bid. No Bid modification shall be permitted unless the corresponding modification notice contains a valid authorization to request the modificationand is read out at Bid opening. Only envelopes that areopened and read out at Bid opening shall be considered further.

All other envelopes shall be opened one at a time, reading out: the name of the Bidder and whether there is a modification; the Bid Prices, including any discounts and alternative offers; the presence of a Bid Security or Bid-Securing Declaration, if required; and any other details as the Purchaser may consider appropriate. Only discounts and alternative offers read out at Bid opening shall be considered for evaluation. No Bid shall be rejected at Bid opening except for late bids, in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 24.1.

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26.4 The Purchaser shall prepare a record of the Bid opening that shall include, as a minimum: the name of the Bidder and whether there is a withdrawal, or modification; the Bid Price, per lot if applicable, including any discounts, and the presence or absence of a Bid Security or Bid-Securing Declaration. The bids that were opened shall be resealed in separate envelopes, promptly after the bid opening. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall be requested to sign the attendance sheet. A copy of the record shall be distributed to all Bidders who submitted bids in time.

Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

- 27. Confidentiality 27.1Information relating to the examination, evaluation, comparison, and post-qualification (if applicable) of bids, and recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process until publication of the Contract Award.
 - 27.2 Any effort by a Bidder to influence the Purchaser in the examination, evaluation, comparison, and post-qualification of the bids or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of its Bid.
 - 27.3 Notwithstanding ITB Sub-Clause 27.2, if any Bidder wishes to contact the Purchaser on any matter related to the bidding process, from the time of bid opening to the time of Contract Award, it should do so in writing.
- 28. Clarification of 28.1 Bids

To assist in the examination, evaluation, comparison and postqualification of the bids, the Purchaser may, at its discretion, request any Bidder for a clarification of its Bid.Any clarification submitted by a Bidder in respect to its Bidand that is not in response to a request by the Purchaser shall not be considered for purpose of evaluation. The Purchaser's request for clarification and the response shallbe in writing. No change in the prices or substance of theBid shall be sought, offered, or permitted, except to confirm the correction of arithmetic errors discovered by the Purchaser in the Evaluation of the bids, in accordance with ITB Clause 30.

29. Responsiveness29.1 of Bids

The Purchaser's determination of a bid's responsiveness isto be based on the contents of the bid itself.

29.2

A substantially responsive Bid is one that conforms to all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the Bidding Documents without material deviation, reservation, or omission. A material deviation, reservation, or omission is one that:

- (a) affects in any substantial way the scope, quality, or performance of the Goods and Related Services specified in the Contract; or
- (b) limits in any substantial way, inconsistent with theBidding Documents, the Purchaser's rights or theBidder's obligations under the Contract; or
- if rectified would unfairly affect the competitive position of other bidders presenting substantially responsive bids.
- 29.3 If abid is not substantially responsive to the BiddingDocuments, it shall be rejected by the Purchaser and maynot subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder bycorrection of the material deviation, reservation, oromission.
- 30. Nonconformities, Errors, and Omissions
- 30.1 Provided that a Bid is substantially responsive, the Purchaser may waive any non-conformities or omissions in the Bid that do not constitute a material deviation.
- Provided that a bid is substantially responsive, the Purchaser may request that the Bidder submit the necessaryinformation or documentation, within a reasonable period oftime, to rectify nonmaterial nonconformities or omissions in the bid related to documentation requirements. Such omission shall notbe related to any aspect of the price of the Bid. Failure of the Bidder to comply with the request may result in the rejection of its Bid.
- Provided that the Bid is substantially responsive, the Purchaser shall correct arithmetical errors on the following basis:
 - if there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the line item totalthat is obtained by multiplying the unitprice by the quantity, the unit price shall prevail and the line item total shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of the Purchaser there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price, in which case the line item total as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected;
 - (b) if there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of subtotals, the subtotals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and
 - (c) if there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail, unless the amountexpressed in words is related to an arithmetic error, in which case the amount in figures shall prevail subject to (a) and (b) above.

- 30.4 If the Bidder that submitted the lowest evaluated Bid does not accept the correction of errors, its Bid shall be disqualified and its Bid Security shall be forfeited or its Bid-Securing Declaration shall be executed.
- 31. Preliminary 31.1 The Purchaser shall examine the bids to confirm that Examination of Bidsall documents and technical documentation requested

in ITB Clause 11 have been provided, and to determine the completeness of each document submitted.

- 31.2 The Purchaser shall confirm that the following documents and information have been provided in the Bid. If any of these documents or information is missing, the Bid shall be rejected.
 - Bid Submission Form, in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 12.1;
 - Price Schedules, in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 12; (b)
 - Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration, in accordance (c) with ITB Clause 20.

32. Examination of 32.1 The Purchaser shall examine the Bid to confirm that all terms and conditions specified in the CC and the Contract Data have been accepted by the Bidder without any material deviation or reservation.

- 32.2 The Purchaser shall evaluate the technical aspects of the Bid submitted in accordance with ITB Clause 17, to confirm that all requirements specified in Section V, Schedule of Requirements of the Bidding Documents have been met without any material deviation or reservation.
- 32.3 If, after the examination of the terms and conditions and the technical evaluation, the Purchaser determines that the Bid is not substantially responsive in accordance with ITB Clause 29, the Purchaser shall reject the Bid.
- 33. Conversion to 33.1 If the bidders are allowed to quote in foreign currencies Currency in Single accordance with sub clause 15.1, for evaluation and

comparison purposes, the Purchaser shall convert all bid prices expressed in foreign currencies in to Sri Lankan Rupees using the selling rates prevailed 28 days prior to closing of bids as published by the Central Bank of Sri Lanka. If this date falls on a public holiday the earliest working day prior to the date shall be applicable.

- 34. Domestic Preference
- 34.1

Domestic preference shall be a factor in bid evaluation onlyif stated in the BDS. If domestic preference shall be a bid-evaluation factor, the methodology for calculating the marginof preference and the criteria for its application shall be asspecified in Section III, evaluation and qualification Criteria.

- 35. Evaluation of 35.1 Bids
- The Purchaser shall evaluate each bid that has been determined, up to this stage of the evaluation, to be substantially responsive.
- To evaluate a Bid, the Purchaser shall only use all the factors, methodologies, and criteria defined in this ITB Clause 35.
- 35.3 To evaluate a Bid, the Purchaser shall consider the following: (c) the Bid Price as quoted in accordance with clause 14;
 - (d) price adjustment for correction of arithmetic errors in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 30.3;
 - (e) price adjustment due to discounts offered in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 14.2; and 14.3
 - (f) adjustments due to the application of the evaluation criteria specified in the BDS from amongst those set out in Section III, Evaluation and Qualification Criteria;
 - (g) Adjustments due to the application of a domestic preference, in accordance with ITB Clause 34 if applicable.
- 35.4 The Purchaser's evaluation of a bid may require the consideration of other factors, in addition to the factors steed in ITB Sub-Clause 35.3, if specified in BDS. These factors may be related to the characteristics, performance, and terms and conditions of purchase of the Goods and Related Services. The effect of the factors selected, if any, shall be expressed in monetary terms to facilitate comparison of bids
- 35.5 If so specified in the BDS, these Bidding Documents shall allow Bidders to quote for one or more lots, and shall allow the Purchaser to award one or multiple lots to more than one Bidder. The methodology of evaluation to determine the lowest-evaluated lot combinations is specified in Section III, Evaluation, and Qualification Criteria.
- 36. Comparison of 36.1 The Purchaser shall compare all substantially responsive

 Bids bids to determine the lowest-evaluated bid, inaccordancewith ITB Clause 35.

- 37. Post qualification of the Bidder
- 37.1 The Purchaser shall determine to its satisfaction whether the Bidder that is selected as having submitted the lowest evaluated and substantially responsive bid is qualified to perform the Contract satisfactorily.
- 37.2 The determination shall be based upon an examination of the documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications submitted by the Bidder, pursuant to ITB Clause 18.
- An affirmative determination shall be a prerequisite for award of the Contract to the Bidder. A negative determination shall result in disqualification of the bid, inwhich event the Purchaser shall proceed to the next lowest evaluated bid to make a similar determination of that Bidder's capabilities to perform satisfactorily.
- 38. Purchaser's
 Right to Accept
 Any Bid, and to
 Reject Any or
 All Bids
- 38.1 The Purchaser reserves the right to accept or reject any bid, and to annul the bidding process and reject all bids at any time prior to contract award, without thereby incurring any liability to Bidders.

Award of Contract

- 39. Award Criteria
- The Purchaser shall award the Contract to the Bidder whoseoffer has been determined to be the lowest evaluated bidand is substantially responsive to the Bidding Documents, provided further that the Bidder is determined to be qualified to perform the Contract satisfactorily.
- 40. Purchaser's
 Right to Vary
 Quantities at
 Time of Award
- At the time the Contract is awarded, the Purchaser reservesthe right to increase or decrease the quantity of Goods andRelated Services originally specified in Section V, Scheduleof Requirements, provided this does not exceed twenty fivepercent (25%) or one unit whichever is higher and withoutany change in the unit prices or other terms and conditions of the bid and the Bidding Documents.
- 41. Notification of Award
- Prior to the expiration of the period of bid validity, the Purchaser shall notify the successful Bidder, in writing, that its Bid has been accepted.
- 41.2 Until a formal Contract is prepared and executed, thenotification of award shall constitute a binding Contract.
- 41.3 Upon the successful Bidder's furnishing of the signed Contract Form and performance security pursuant to ITB Clause 43, the Purchaser will promptly notify each unsuccessful Bidder and will discharge its bid security, pursuant to ITB Clause 20.4.

- 42. Signing of Contract
- 42.1 Within Seven (7) days after notification, the Purchaser shallcomplete the Agreement, and inform the successful Bidder to sign it.
- 42.2 Within Seven (7) days of receipt of such information, the successful Bidder shall sign the Agreement.
- 43. Performance Security
- 43.1 Within fourteen (14) days of the receipt of notification of award from the Purchaser, the successful Bidder, if required, shall furnish the Performance Security in accordance with the CC, using for that purpose the Performance Security Form included in Section VIII Contract forms. The Employer shall promptly notify the name of the winning Bidder to each unsuccessful Bidder and discharge the Bid Securities of the unsuccessful bidder pursuant to ITB Sub-Clause 20.4.
- 43.2 Failure of the successful Bidder to submit the above- mentioned Performance Security or sign the Contract shall constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award and forfeiture of the Bid Security or execution of the Bid-Securing Declaration. In that event the Purchaser may award the Contract to the next lowest evaluated Bidder, whose offer is substantially responsive and is determined by the Purchaser to be qualified to perform the Contract satisfactorily.

Section VI. Conditions of Contract

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Section VI. Conditions of Contract

- 1. Definitions
- 1.1 The following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:
 - (a) "Contract" means the Contract Agreement entered into between the Purchaser and the Supplier, together with the Contract Documents referred to therein, including allattachments, appendices, and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
 - (b) "Contract Documents" means the documents listed in the Contract Agreement, including any amendments thereto.
 - (c) "Contract Price" means the price payable to the Supplier as specified in the Contract Agreement, subject to such additions and adjustments thereto or deductions therefrom, as may be made pursuant to the Contract.
 - (d) "Day" means calendar day.
 - (e) "Completion" means the fulfillment of the supply ofGoods to the destination specified and completion ofthe Related Services by the Supplier in accordancewith the terms and conditions set forth in theContract.
 - (f) "CC" means the Conditions of Contract.
 - (g) "Goods" means all of the commodities, raw material, machinery and equipment, and/or other materials that the Supplier is required to supply to the Purchaser under the Contract.
 - (h) "Purchaser" means the entity purchasing the Goods and Related Services, as specified in the Contract Data.
 - (i) "Related Services" means the services incidental to the supply of the goods, such as insurance, installation, training and initial maintenance and other such obligations of the Supplier under the Contract.
 - (j) "Subcontractor" means any natural person, private orgovernment entity, or a combination of the above, towhom any part of the Goods to be supplied orexecution of any part of the Related Services issubcontracted by the Supplier.

(k) "Supplier" means the natural person, private or government entity, or a combination of the above, whose bid to perform the Contract has been accepted by the Purchaser and is named as such in the Contract Agreement.

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- (l) "The Project Site," where applicable, means the place named in the Contract Data.
- 2. Contract Documents

2.1

- Subject to the order of precedence set forth in the ContractAgreement, all documents forming the Contract (and all parts thereof) are intended to be correlative, complementary, and mutually explanatory. The ContractAgreement shall be read as a whole.
- 3. Fraud and 3.1 Corruption
- The Government of Sri Lanka requires the Purchaseraswell as bidders, suppliers, contractors, and consultants toobserve the highest standard of ethics during the procurementand execution of such contracts. In pursuit of this policy:
- (i) "corrupt practice" means offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of apublic official in the procurement process or incontract execution;
- (ii) "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation or omission of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract;
- (iii) "collusivepractice" meansaschemeorarrangement between two or more bidders, withor without the knowledge of the Purchaser toestablish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitivelevels; and
- (iv) "coercivepractice" meansharming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the procurement process or affect the execution of a correct.
- 4. Interpretation 4.1 If the context so requires it, singular means plural and vice versa.

4.2 Entire Agreement

Purchaser and the Supplier and supersedes all communications, negotiations and agreements (whetherwritten or oral) of the parties with respect thereto made prior to the date of Contract.

4.3 Amendment

No amendment or other variation of the Contract shall bevalid unless it is in writing, is dated, expressly refers to the Contract, and is signed by a duly authorized representative of each party thereto.

4.4 Severability

If any provision or condition of the Contract is prohibitedor rendered invalid or unenforceable, such prohibition, invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the validity orenforceability of any other provisions and conditions of the Contract.

5. Language

5.1

The Contract as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Contract exchanged by the Supplier and the Purchaser, shall be written in English language. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Contract may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in the language specified, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Contract, this translations hall govern.

5.2 The Supplier shall bear all costs of translation to the governing language and all risks of the accuracy of suchtranslation, for documents provided by the Supplier.

Joint Venture, Consortium or Association

6.1

If the Supplier is a joint venture, consortium, orassociation, all of the parties shall be jointly and severallyliable to the Purchaser for the fulfillment of the provisions of the Contract and shall designate one party to act as aleader with authority to bind the joint venture, consortium, or association. The composition or the constitution of the joint venture, consortium, or association shall not be altered without the prior consent of the Purchaser.

7. Eligibility

7.1 All goods supplied under this contract shall be complied with applicable standards stipulated by the Sri LankaStandards Institute. In the absence of such standards, theGoods supplied shall be complied with other internationally accepted standards, such as British Standards.

8. Notices

- Any notice given by one party to the other pursuant to the Contract shall be in writing to the address specified in the Contract Data. The term "in writing" means communicated in written form with proof of receipt.
- 8.2 A notice shall be effective when delivered or on thenotice's effective date, whichever is later.

- 9. Governing Law
- 9.1
- The Contract shall be governed by and interpreted inaccordance with the laws of the Democratic SocialistRepublic of Sri Lanka.
- 10. Settlement of Disputes
- 10.1 The Purchaser and the Supplier shall make every effort toresolve amicably by direct informal negotiation any disagreement or dispute arising between them under or inconnection with the Contract.
- 10.2 If, after twenty-eight (28) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the Purchaser or the Supplier may give notice to the other party of its intention to commence arbitration, as hereinafter provided, as to the matter in dispute, and no arbitration in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given. Any dispute or difference in respect of which a notice of intention to commence arbitration has been given in accordance with this Clause shall be finally settled by arbitration. Arbitration may be commenced prior to or after delivery of the Goods under the Contract. Arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the Arbitration Act No.11 of 1995.
- 10.3 Notwithstanding any reference to arbitration herein,
 - (a) obligations under the Contract unless they otherwise agree;
 - (b) the Purchaser shall pay the Supplier any monies due the Supplier.
- 11. Scope of Supply
- 11.1 The Goods and Related Services to be supplied shall be as specified in the Schedule of Requirements.
- 12. Delivery and Documents
- 12.1 Subject to CC Sub-Clause 32.1, the Delivery of the Goods and Completion of the Related Services shall be in accordance with the Delivery and Completion Schedule specified in the Schedule of Requirements. Where applicable the details of shipping and other documents to be furnished by the Supplier are specified in the Contract Data.
- 13. Supplier's Responsibilities
- 13.1 The Supplier shall supply all the Goods and RelatedServices included in the Scope of Supply in accordance withCC Clause 11, and the Delivery and Completion Schedule, as per CC Clause 12.
- 14. Contract Price
- 14.1 Prices charged by the Supplier for the Goods supplied and the Related Services performed under the Contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the Supplier in its bid.

15. Terms of Payment

- 15.1 The Contract Price, shall be paid as specified in the Contract Data.
- 15.2 The Supplier's request for payment shall be made to the Purchaser in writing, accompanied by invoices describing, as appropriate, the Goods delivered and Related Services performed, and by the documents submitted pursuant to CC Clause 12 and upon fulfillment of all other obligations stipulated in the Contract.

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- 15.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the Purchaser, but in no case later than twenty eight (28) days after submission of an invoice or request for payment by the Supplier, and after the Purchaser has accepted it.
- 16. Taxes and Duties
- 16.1 The Supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted Goods to the Purchaser.
- 17. Performance Security
- 17.1 If required as specified in the Contract Data, the Supplier shall, within fourteen (14) days of the notification of contract award, provide a performance security of Ten percent (10%) of the Contract Price for the performance of the Contract.
- 17.2 The proceeds of the Performance Security shall be payable to the Purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the Supplier's failure to complete its obligations under the Contract.
 - 17.3 As specified in the Contract Data, the Performance Security, if required, shall be in Sri Lanka Rupees and shall be in the format stipulated by the Purchaser in the Contract Data, or in another format acceptable to the Purchaser.
 - 17.4 The Performance Security shall be discharged by the Purchaser and returned to the Supplier not later than twenty-eight (28) days following the date of Completion of the Supplier's performance obligations under the Contract, including any warranty obligations.
- 18. Copyright
- 18.1 The copyright in all drawings, documents, and other materials containing data and information furnished to the Purchaser by the Supplier herein shall remain vested in the Supplier, or, if they are furnished to the Purchaser directly or through the Supplier by any third party, including suppliers of materials, the copyright in such materials shall remain vested in such third party.

19. Confidential information

- 19.1The Purchaser and the Supplier shall keep confidential andshall not, without the written consent of the other partyhereto, divulge to any third party any documents, data, orother information furnished directly or indirectly by theother party hereto in connection with the Contract, whethersuch information has been furnished prior to, during orfollowing completion or termination of the Contract.Notwithstanding the above, the Supplier may furnish to itsSubcontractor such documents, data, and other informationit receives from the Purchaser to the extent required for theSubcontractor to perform its work under the Contract, inwhich event the Supplier shall obtain from suchSubcontractor an undertaking of confidentiality similar tothat imposed on the Supplier under CC Clause 19.
- 19.2 The Purchaser shall not use such documents, data, and other information received from the Supplier for any purposes unrelated to the contract. Similarly, the Supplier shall not use such documents, data, and other information received from the Purchaser for any purpose other than the performance of the Contract.
- 19.3 The above provisions of CC Clause 19 shall not in any way modify any undertaking of confidentiality given by either of the parties hereto prior to the date of the Contract in respect of the Supply or any part thereof.
- 19.4 The provisions of CC Clause 19 shall survive completion or termination, for whatever reason, of the Contract.

20. Subcontracting

- 20.1 The Supplier shall notify the Purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under the Contract if not alreadyspecified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later shall not relieve the Supplier from any of its obligations, duties, responsibilities, or liability under the Contract.
- 20.2 Subcontracts shall comply with the provisions of CC Clauses 3 and 7.

20. Specifications

- 21.1 Technical Specifications and Drawings and Standards
 - (a) The Goods and Related Services supplied under this Contract shall conform to the technical specifications and standards mentioned in Section V, Schedule of Requirements and, when no applicable standard is mentioned, the standard shall be equivalent or superior to the official standards whose application is appropriate to the Goods' country of origin.

- (b)

 The Supplier shall be entitled to disclaimresponsibility for any design, data, drawing, specification or other document, or any modification thereof provided or designed by or on behalf of the Purchaser, by giving a notice of such disclaimer to the Purchaser.
- (c) Wherever references are made in the Contract tocodes and standards in accordance with which it shallbe executed, the edition or the revised version of suchcodes and standards shall be those specified in the Schedule of Requirements During Contract execution, any changes in any such codes and standards shall be applied only after approval by the Purchaser and shall be treated in accordance with CCC lause 32.
- 22. Packing and Documents
- 22.1 The Supplier shall pack the Goods as is required to preventheir damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the Contract.
- 23. Insurance
- Unless otherwise specified in the Contract Data, the Goods supplied under the Contract shall be fully insured against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage, and delivery.
- 24. Transportation
- 24.1 Unless otherwise specified in the Contract Data, responsibility for arranging transportation of the Goodsshall be a responsibility of the supplier.
- 25. Inspections and Tests
- 25.1 The Supplier shall at its own expense and at no cost to the Purchaser carry out all such tests and/or inspections of the Goods and Related Services as are specified in the Contract Data.
- 25.2 Theinspections and tests may be conducted on thepremises of the Supplier or its Subcontractor, at point ofdelivery, and/or at the Goods' final destination, or inanother place as specified in the Contract Data. Subjectto CC Sub-Clause 25.3, if conducted on the premises of theSupplier or its Subcontractor, all reasonable facilities andassistance, including access to drawings and productiondata, shall be furnished to the inspectors at no charge to thePurchaser.
- 25.3 The Purchaser or its designated representative shall beentitled to attend the tests and/or inspections referred to inCC Sub-Clause 25.2, provided that the Purchaser bear allof its own costs and expenses incurred in connection withsuch attendance including, but not limited to, all traveling and board and lodging expenses.

25.4 Whenever the Supplier is ready to carry out any such test and inspection, it shall give a reasonable advance notice, including the place and time, to the Purchaser. The Supplier shall obtain from any relevant third party or manufacturer any necessary permission or consent to enable the Purchaser or its designated representative to attend the test and/or inspection.

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- 25.5 The Purchaser may require the Supplier to carry out any test and/or inspection not required by the Contract but deemed necessary to verify that the characteristics and performance of the Goods comply with the technical specifications codes and standards under the Contract, provided that the Supplier's reasonable costs and expenses incurred in the carrying out of such test and/or inspection shall be added to the Contract Price. Further, if such test and/or inspection impede the progress of manufacturing and/or the Supplier's performance of its other obligations under the Contract, due allowance will be made in respect of the Delivery Dates and Completion Dates and the other obligations so affected.
- 25.6 The Supplier shall provide the Purchaser with a report of the results of any such test and/or inspection.
- 25.7 The Purchaser may reject any Goods or any part thereof that fail to pass any test and/or inspection or do not conform to the specifications. The Supplier shall either rectify or replace such rejected Goods or parts thereof or make alterations necessary to meet the specifications at no cost to the Purchaser, and shall repeat the test and/or inspection, at no cost to the Purchaser, upon giving a notice pursuant to CC Sub-Clause 25.4.
- 25.8 The Supplier agrees that neither the execution of a test and/or inspection of the Goods or any part thereof, nor the attendance by the Purchaser or its representative, nor the issue of any report pursuant to CC Sub-Clause 25.6, shall release the Supplier from any warranties or other obligations under the Contract.
- 26. Liquidated Damages
- 26.1 Except as provided under CC Clause 31, if the Supplier fails to deliver any or all of the Goods by the Date(s) of delivery or perform the Related Services within the period specified in the Contract, the Purchaser may without prejudice to all its other remedies under the Contract, deduct from the Contract Price, as liquidated damages, a sum equivalent to the percentage specified in the Contract Data of the delivered price of the delayed Goods or unperformed Services for each week or part thereof of delay until actual delivery or performance, up to amaximum deduction of the percentage specified in thoseContract Data. Once the maximum is reached, thePurchaser may terminate the Contract pursuant to CCClause 34.

27. Warranty

27.1 The Supplier warrants that all the Goods are new, unused, and of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials, unless provided otherwise in the Contract.

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- 27.2 Subject to CC Sub-Clause 21.1(b), the Supplier furtherwarrants that the Goods shall be free from defects arising from any act or omission of the Supplier or arising from from arising, materials, and workmanship, under normal use in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 27.3 Unless otherwise specified in the Contract Data, thewarranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months afterthe Goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, havebeen delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the Contract Data.
- 27.4 The Purchaser shall give notice to the Supplier stating thenature of any such defects together with all available evidence thereof, promptly following the discovery thereof. The Purchaser shall afford all reasonable opportunity for the Supplier to inspect such defects.
- 27.5 Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, within theperiod specified in the Contract Data, expeditiously repairor replace the defective Goods or parts thereof, at no cost to the Purchaser.
- 27.6If having been notified, the Supplier fails to remedy thedefect within the period specified in the Contract Data, the Purchaser may proceed to take within a reasonable period such remedial action as may be necessary, at the Supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to anyother rights which the Purchaser may have against the Supplier under the Contract.

28. Patent Indemnity

28.1The Supplier shall, subject to the Purchaser's compliancewith CC Sub-Clause 28.2, indemnify and hold harmless the Purchaser and its employees and officers from and againstany and all suits, actions or administrative proceedings, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, and expenses of any nature, including attorney's fees and expenses, which the Purchaser may suffer as a result of any infringement or alleged infringement of any patent, utility model, registered design, trademark, copyright, or other intellectual property right registered or otherwise existing at the date of the Contract by reason of: (a) the installation of the Goods by the Supplier or theuse of the Goods in the country where the Site islocated; and

(b) the sale in any country of the products produced bythe Goods.

Such indemnity shall not cover any use of the Goods or anypart thereof other than for the purpose indicated by or to bereasonably inferred from the Contract, neither anyinfringement resulting from the use of the Goods or anypart thereof, or any products produced thereby inassociation or combination with any other equipment, plant, or materials not supplied by the Supplier, pursuant tothe Contract.

- 28.2If any proceedings are brought or any claim is made against the Purchaser arising out of the matters referred to in CCSub-Clause 28.1, the Purchaser shall promptly give the Supplier a notice thereof, and the Supplier may at its ownexpense and in the Purchaser's name conduct such proceedings or claim and any negotiations for these tlement of any such proceedings or claim.
- 28.3 If the Supplier fails to notify the Purchaser within twenty-eight (28) days after receipt of such notice that it intends toconduct any such proceedings or claim, then the Purchasershall be free to conduct the same on its own behalf.
- 28.4 The Purchaser shall, at the Supplier's request, afford alavailable assistance to the Supplier in conducting suchproceedings or claim, and shall be reimbursed by the Supplier for all reasonable expenses incurred in so doing.
- 28.5 The Purchaser shall indemnify and hold harmless the Supplier and its employees, officers, and Subcontractors from and against any and all suits, actions or administrative proceedings, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, and expenses of any nature, including attorney's fees and expenses, which the Supplier may suffer as a result of any infringement or alleged infringement of any patent, utility model, registered design, trademark, copyright, or other intellectual property right registered or otherwise existing at the date of the Contract arising out of or in connection with any design, data, drawing, specification, or other documents or materials provided or designed by or on behalf of the Purchaser.
- 29. Limitation of Liability
- 29.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willfulmisconduct,

- (a) the Supplier shall not be liable to the Purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the Supplier to pay liquidated damages to the Purchaser and
- (b) the aggregate liability of the Supplier to the Purchaser, whether under the Contract, in tort or otherwise, shallnot exceed the total Contract Price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing orreplacing defective equipment, or to any obligation of the supplier to indemnify the purchaser with respect topatent infringement
- 30. Change in Laws and Regulations
- 30.1 Unless otherwise specified in the Contract, if after the date of 28 days prior to date of Bid submission, any law,regulation, ordinance, order or bylaw having the force of law is enacted, promulgated, abrogated, or changed in SriLanka that subsequently affects the Delivery Date and/orthe Contract Price, then such Delivery Date and/or ContractPrice shall be correspondingly increased or decreased, to the extent that the Supplier has thereby been affected in the performance of any of its obligations under the Contract. Notwithstanding the foregoing, such additional or reducedcost shall not be separately paid or credited if the same has already been accounted for in the price adjustment provisions where applicable, in accordance with CC Clause 14.
- 31. Force Majeure
- 31.1 The Supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of itsPerformance Security, liquidated damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that it's delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the Contract is the result of an event of Force Majeure.
- 31.2 For purposes of this Clause, "Force Majeure" means anevent or situation beyond the control of the Supplier that isnot foreseeable, is unavoidable, and its origin is not due tonegligence or lack of care on the part of the Supplier. Suchevents may include, but not be limited to, acts of the Purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, and freightembargoes.
- 31.3 If a Force Majeure situation arises, the Supplier shallpromptly notify the Purchaser in writing of such conditionand the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the Purchaser in writing, the Supplier shall continue to performits obligations under the Contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event.

- 32. Change Orders and Contract Amendments
- 32.1 The Purchaser may at any time order the Supplier throughnotice in accordance CC Clause 8, to make changes withinthe general scope of the Contract in any one or more of thefollowing:
 - (a) drawings, designs, or specifications, where Goods tobe furnished under the Contract are to be specificallymanufactured for the Purchaser;
 - (b) the method of shipment or packing;
 - (c) the place of delivery; and
 - (d) the Related Services to be provided by the Supplier.
- 32.2 If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for, the Supplier's performance of any provisions under the Contract, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Contract Price or in the Delivery/Completion Schedule, or both, and the Contract shall accordingly be amended. Any claims by the Supplier for adjustment under this Clause must be asserted within twenty-eight (28) days from the date of the Supplier's receipt of the Purchaser's change order.
- 32.3 Prices to be charged by the Supplier for any Related Services that might be needed but which were not included in the Contract shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the Supplier for similar services.
 - 32.4 Subject to the above, no variation in or modification of the terms of the Contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties.
- 33 Extensions of Time
- 33.1If at any time during performance of the Contract, the Supplier or its subcontractors should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the Goods or completion of Related Services pursuant to CC Clause 12, the Supplier shall promptly notify the Purchaser in writing of the delay, its likely duration, and its cause. As soon as practicable after receipt of the Supplier's notice, the Purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at its discretion extend the Supplier's time for performance, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of the Contract.
- 33.2 Except in case of Force Majeure, as provided under CC Clause 31, a delay by the Supplier in the performance of its Delivery and Completion obligations shall render the Supplier liable to the imposition of liquidated damages pursuant to CC Clause 26, unless an extension of time is agreed upon, pursuant to CC Sub-Clause 33.1.

34. Termination 34.1 Termination for Default

- (a) The Purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of Contract, by written notice of default sent to the Supplier, may terminate the Contract in whole or in part:
 - (i) if the Supplier fails to deliver any or all of the Goods within the period specified in the Contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the Purchaser pursuant to CC Clause 33;

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- (ii) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation under the Contract; or
- (iii) if the Supplier, in the judgment of the Purchaser has engaged in fraud and corruption, as defined in CC Clause 3, in competing for or in executing the Contract.
- (b) In the event the Purchaser terminates the Contract in whole or in part, pursuant to CC Clause 34.1(a), the Purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, Goods or Related Services similar to those undelivered or not performed, and the Supplier shall be liable to the Purchaser for any additional costs for such similar Goods or Related Services. However, the Supplier shall continue performance of the Contract to the extent not terminated.

34.2 Termination for Insolvency.

(a) The Purchaser may at any time terminate the Contract by giving notice to the Supplier if the Supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In such event, termination will be without compensation to the Supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy that has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the Purchaser

34.3 Termination for Convenience.

(a) The Purchaser, by notice sent to the Supplier, may terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that termination is for the Purchaser's convenience, the extent to which performance of the

Supplier under the Contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.

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- (b) The Goods that are complete and ready for shipment within twenty-eight (28) days after the Supplier's receipt of notice of termination shall be accepted by the Purchaser at the Contract terms and prices. For the remaining Goods, the Purchaser may elect:
 - (i) to have any portion completed and delivered at the Contract terms and prices; and/or
 - (ii) to cancel the remainder and pay to the Supplier an agreed amount for partially completed Goods and Related Services and for materials and parts previously procured by the Supplier.
- 35. Assignment 35.1 Neither the Purchaser nor the Supplier shall assign, in whole or in part, their obligations under this Contract, except with prior written consent of the other party.
